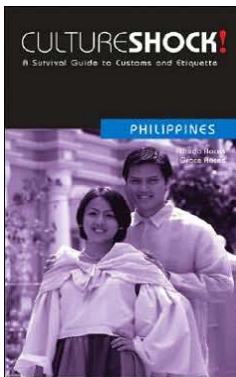


Book Description

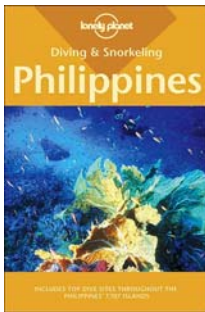

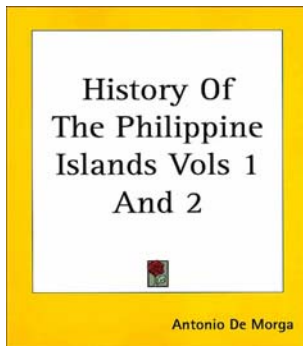
